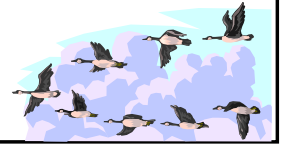

Equipment Report - Clamhawg Clamming Gun



Tony and I tried out our brand new Clamhawg clam guns this weekend. I discovered these clam guns off a youtube video and decided to order the 5" diameter, 37" long Clamhawg model from <http://www.crabhawk.com>. They also sell a 4 1/2" diameter Clamhawg model, but I prefer the larger tubes, since I break fewer clams.

Most 5" diameter clam guns are a lot of work to pull back out of the sand due to the suction. The great thing about these clam guns are that they have an air vent to release the suction and are very easy to use. The air vent only goes the length of the tube so it can get clogged, but it cleans easily by dunking it in water.

The gun is made from a stainless steel tube and a heavy duty PVC handle. It seems well built and the only negatives

are that the black paint on the handle scratches fairly easily and the \$100 price.

All in all this clamgun was much easier to use and recommended.

June Camping Trip - Riffe Lake

Riffe lake has plenty of fishing opportunities. From my brief research it appears that a lot of people troll for small silvers in the lake using a variety of gear, like pink mini squid, pink wedding rings, etc. Basically fish them like Kokanees.

It's a large lake so you'll probably want at a boat with an outboard on it to fish.

You can also fish from the bridge using worms or shrimp. It sounds like people do well

there, but loose a number of fish when they have to reel them up from the water to the bridge. One person suggested putting a bridle on a landing net and lifting it up like a crab ring.

If you don't have a suitable boat or feel like fishing from the bridge, there's also nearby Swofford Pond. We fished that last time were their and did really well catching trout on the standard lures like wedding rings and chartreuse powerbait. This lake is small enough that you can fish it from rowing a raft or pontoon boat comfortably.

If you think there's a chance that you might be interested in this trip I'd recommend that you reserve a campsite. You can always cancel it as it gets closer, but there's no guarantee that you'll find one if you decide to go at the last minute.
