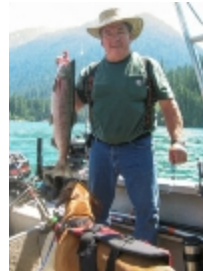
### Baker Lake Sockeye Fishing Trip Report

## Totems Anniston Trip



The Totems had a great trip to Anniston Alabama.

The Thunderbirds team finished 9th in the NRA Air Rifle Championships, 8th in the Junior Olympic Air Rifle Championships, and 14th in the CMP Air Rifle Championships.

Alec Patajo had a personal best on 587 during the competition.

He finished 2nd in the Sub Junior category (14&under) in the Junior Olympics, and is the Sub Junior National Champion in the CMP Championships.

Jack Ellis put a string of personal best scores shooting a 570, 572 and a 571. He finished 7th in the Sub Junior Class in the Junior Olympic Championships, and 6th SJ in the CMP Championships.

Casey Iwamoto shot a personal best everyday. She shot a 572 followed by a 575 and finished with a 583 during the CMP

Championships, where she finished 10th in the Intermediate Junior Class(15-17).



Sumner Ames also turned in a pair of personal best scores in competition shooting in the 560s for the first time.

Nick Young also shot some personal bests. On the last day, a screw failed on his butt plate during offhand sighting. We were able to fix his rifle from the spare rifle we brought. Nick got the gun adjusted and shot a 10.8 to start offhand.



Twelve year old Vic Yeasting showed tremendous poise un-

der pressure during the Junior Olympics. While adjusting his gun for offhand, his sights got moved off track. We fixed the issue, but he had to sight in during the scoring portion of the competition. He battled back to finish with. 503 for the day, and the next day went out a shot a personal best of 531.

Beside the scores, the team had a great outing. Team Captain Owen Yeasting led the Totems in a Nerf battle. Time in the pool helped everyone relax, and I think the Trips to get frozen yogurt seemed to be a hit.

## Kesselring Gun Shop News

Not sure how many of you have been tracking this on the web, but it appears Kesselring Gun Shop ran into problems with the BATF and are surrendering their FFL. Speculation is that it's due to faulty record keeping, but neither Kesselring's or the BATF are talking.

It also appears that they have until October to sell their remaining firearm inventory and are offering 15% off firearms through the month of August.

Their Facebook page does say that they will remain in business afterwards, selling ammo and accessories, but will no longer sell firearms.

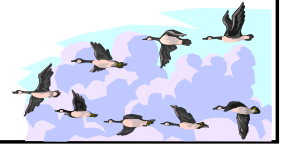
