Kids Fishing Pond – June 13th from 8am to 11am at Seacrest Park (1660 Harbor Ave SW)

Here's the event kids and volunteers look forward to all year! Our annual free Kid's Fishing Pond that we host for West Seattle and the surrounding communities. If you only volunteer for one event this year, this is the one. There's nothing quite like seeing the excitement on a kid's face as they catch their first fish with their parents or the gratification of seeing kids come back year after year. This can lay the foundation for a lifelong hobby for these kids and get them excited about something more than just video games.

We need a lot of volunteer help for this event. We'll start setting up the pond at 9am on Friday, June 12th and the hatchery usually delivers the trout around 1pm. We need people to help setup and then take turns watching the pond the entire plastic silverware, soda's and water. time it's there. This includes the overnight shift which is usually a lot of fun to work. Then the bulk of 7:15am Saturday morning and finish the setup and get ready for the kids to arrive. For the next three hours we help 150+ kids catch their fish! We're usually done with cleanup around 12:30-1pm on Saturday.

> What can you do to help? To start with, pass the word of the event to everyone you know that has kids (age 14 and younger). You can

download a flyer to print out at http://wssportsmen.com/kidsfishing. pdf. You can also find information on the calendar on our Club's website http://wssportsmen.org.

The next thing you can do is to volunteer to help! You won't regret it. You don't need any experience as we'll have people there to show you what to do. There are also a variety of jobs from registering kids, to untangling fishing lines, to baiting hooks, to helping the kids with the fish when the catch them. So even if you're not comfortable handling the fish there are things for you to help with. Another thing is to bring your kids to let them help. It works out really well and we've had a lot of high school students help in order to get some of their volunteer hours in
