Totems Shooting News

The Totems have had another busy month. They competed in the Icicle match at the beginning of January, the State Air Rifle Championship, the Civilian Marksmanship Program's Postal Match and the American Legion Postal Match.

The Icicle is a local only match, but it does offer an Olympic Style final. Three Totems finished in the top 10: Lauren, Emma and Casey.

This equals the largest number of Totems to reach the finals in this event. Pressure mounts as the score of each shot is announced. Fortunately, the girls were up to the challenge and did quite well.

The State Air Rifle match was held in Olympia and featured 13 Totems in the event. The event consists of 2 matches: a 40 shot offhand and a 60 shot 3 Position match. Lauren won the 3 Position match, came in 2nd in offhand match and finished 2nd overall. Lauren was the highest scoring Junior in the match. Alec Patajo came in 3rd overall and Emma Carey came in 5th. The rest of the totems had a strong showing with a number of personal best set by Case, Vic, Sumner, Casey, Katelynn and Nick.

The CMP Postal match is a 30 shot 3P match, which was shot at West Seattle. They take the top 4 finishers to select the top team. The Thunderbird team of Alec, Owen, Corinne and Lauren shot a combined score of 1147/1200, which should place them high in the ranking nationally.

The Chiefs team of Casey, Katelynn, Emma and Jack shot a 1130, which would have qualified the team for nationals last year. We will see if the scores hold up for an invite to regionals.

Lastly, the American Legion match was held on Jan 30. In this match the shooter are fighting to make the top ten nationally to get invited to the second round. The top 30 individuals qualify for the individual section of the match as well. The Thunderbird team of Lauren, Casey, Emma and Owen shot a 2302/2400. Lauren shot a 584/600 to finish on top for the night. Now we just wait for the results to be published.

The Totems are in action for the next 7 weekends as they compete in 8 NRA Sectional events, a Jr Olympic Qualifier, the State Indoor Smallbore Championships and the Groundhog match.†

Feb 16&17. State 4P State Championships

This is the Open Individual and Team Championships. If you shoot rifle winter league, then you should this match. Targets are A-17. Course is 20 shot per position for an 80 total match. Team portion is an additional 10 shots per position. The juniors would like to see some adult teams and former totems. In this match.

Feb 24&24 Open International Air Rifle Sectional

The open sectional is a 60 shot offhand air match. There is also a team portion to this match. Infiltration squadding is being used.

March 2&3 Open 3P Sectional

This is a full course match (40 shots per position). Space is limited on this. If you are interested, please sign up early. Team competition is also available

March 16&17 Open 3P Air Rifle Sectional

This is 20 shots per position with an air rifle. Team competition is available.

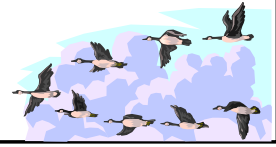

Trip Report - Columbia River Sturgeon Fishing

Tom Kocir talked a few of us into foolishly joining him to go down to the Columbia River and attempt to catch some sturgeon during a brief opener at the Bonneville Reservoir during January. Tom setup the trip with Aaron Wilson, who runs Latitude47Fishing Guide Service (www.Yourfishin.com) for Saturday, January 19th. The plan was for Steve Loo and myself to meet Tom, Rick and Tom's Grandson Manny down in Hood River, OR on Friday. Steve and I made a leisurely drive down and stopped by Lamiglas in Woodland. I needed them to replace a tip guide on a sturgeon rod, which they did, without charge, while we waited. We checked out their outlet store for a while and struggled to convince ourselves not to load up on the great deals they had there (\$50 salmon and halibut rods). After leaving Lamiglas we headed down to a place in Portland for dinner that is somewhat infamous for good steaks at a low price. Probably not the best steaks we've ever had, but a pretty decent 8oz ribeye steak (with potato and salad bar) for only \$7.

After that we finally made it over to the Best Western in Hood River to meet up with the other guys.

We met Aaron at the boat ramp the next morning at 7am and after getting ourselves loaded aboard his 23.5' Wool-dridge open aluminum boat, he made a short run up river where he dropped anchor and rigged up. He was using Okuma rods and reels, with spectra line and used smelt for bait. It didn't take long before we were getting bites, but they kept being undersized. We could only keep fish between 38" and 54". Unfortunately that was the pattern for the entire 7 ½ hours we fished, with the exception of a nice 42" keeper Manny landed.



We definitely had no complaints with Aaron, our guide. He put us on the fish and we probably caught around 65 fish for the day, between the five of us, but only one keeper. In fact, our boat and his friend's boat that was fishing next to us brought in the only three legal fish on the river for the day.



Oh, and did I mention it was really, really cold. It probably didn't get above about 25 degrees all day in that open aluminum boat and we were all feeling it. †
